

UPDATED Wookey Primary School P.E. and Sport Funding Report 2018/19

We received £16700 P.E. and Sport Premium funding in the past 12 months. We used the funding in the following ways:

Expenditure	Impact
£5465 to support the continued employment of a qualified sports coach to work with the staff to improve sporting provision.	Governor monitoring has shown extremely high levels of pupil engagement across the school in high quality P.E. sessions.
£2000 to pay for improvements to outside learning areas to promote active play across the school.	New outside learning areas are being well used by all children to support their active learning.
£2000 to purchase new technology which will allow children to assess and review their outcomes in school P.E. sessions effectively.	New whiteboard and project purchased for Chestnut class – P.E. coach has been trained in using seesaw to capture evidence of children’s learning in P.E. to share in class.
£800 to pay for subscription / transport costs to enable children to take part in a wider variety of sporting fixtures and opportunities.	We took part in TLE sporting leagues, with weekly fixtures, that we would not have been able to do without hiring minibus. We also took part in Mendip Cross Country League. Participation in inter-school sport at Wookey is at its highest level ever.
£500 to pay for existing support staff to run an after school netball club.	This was very well attended and contributed to our success in the netball league.
£1000 to subsidise a new reward system and active project (Kx365) to encourage children to take up more active challenges as part of their school lives.	Housepoint system rewards children for being active – they have responded very well to this. Kx365 project was responded to well by all children.
£1000 to purchase new equipment for use in P.E. sessions and at lunchtimes.	These purchases have supported the delivery of high quality provision.

How will we make sure these improvements are sustainable over time?

- Continued monitoring of P.E. sessions delivered by sports coach and teaching staff
- Continued focus on impact of focus on active learning during class time

- Continued monitoring of uptake in inter-school sport
- Continued monitoring of house point system rewarding children who are active

Spending for 2018/19 academic year.

We are expecting to receive a similar amount of P.E. and Sport Premium funding for the next 12 months and we plan to utilise it primarily in the following ways:

£2000 to pay for improvements to outside learning areas to promote active play across the school.	Phase 2 of improvements started in previous academic year.
£2000 to purchase new technology which will allow children to assess and review their outcomes in school P.E. sessions effectively.	Phase 2 of improvements started in previous academic year.
£1000 to pay for subscription / transport costs to enable children to take part in a wider variety of sporting fixtures and opportunities.	Build on the culture of sporting success that now exists at Wookey Primary School.

Impact of 2018/19 Spending

Although 'active maths' did not come to pass, 'wellbeing through yoga' is now being used across the school by school staff. This has had a notable impact on the engagement of children, including children with SEND needs, and it has resulted in smoother transition times throughout the school day.

All classes now have outside learning areas which are used on a daily basis. This has increased the amount of active play / learning that children take part in.

Inter-school sports participation is now at an all-time high, with TLE sports leagues throughout the year involving roughly 50% of children in KS2.
